About this course report

This course report follows the Vice-Chancellor's template for course reports (Ref. No. SU FV 1.1.2-34-20). The course report is a compilation of the students' views on the course as expressed in the course evaluation (see appendix) and the teachers' views.

About the course evaluation

The course evaluation was completed by 6 of 28 students registered for the course, which is approximately 21%.

Description of any changes and decisions made since the previous course

As I was new in the role of Course Director and teacher, the content of some lectures and seminars differed from previous course instances.

Strengths of the course according to the students (Summary based on quantitative results, free-text responses, and other evaluations during the course)

There is a unanimous consensus that students were satisfied with the course and considered its content relevant for achieving the intended learning outcomes.

Students identified the following as the strongest elements of the course: the teachers and teaching methods; the interactive nature of the seminars; the feedback provided by the teachers; and the course textbook.

Weaknesses of the course according to the students (Summary based on quantitative results, free-text responses, and other evaluations during the course)

One free-text response to Question 7 ("What improvements would you suggest?") in the course evaluation proposed allocating more points to the Moot Court examination. Another student indicated that there were too many seminars.

Course coordinator's and teaching staff's analysis of the course's implementation and results

The Course Director and the other members of the teaching team are satisfied with the implementation of the course. Oral feedback from students further confirms a high level of overall satisfaction with the course.

Conclusions, suggestions for changes, and decisions for future course instances

For future iterations of the course, more points will be allocated to the Moot Court exercise, with a corresponding reduction in the points allocated to the case brief.

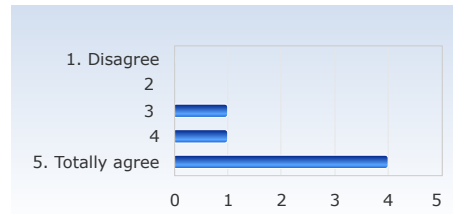

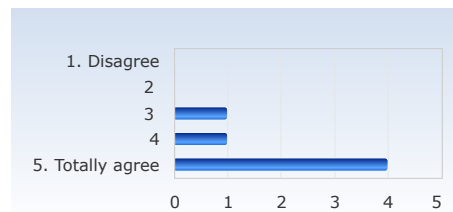

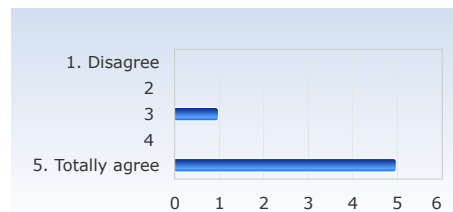

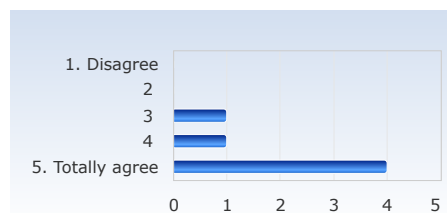
