Composition of the program

The program is a coherent degree program that comprises 120 credits, meaning four semesters of full-time studies on campus. The program consists of four main blocks:

- Block A: 30 credits of compulsory courses
- Block B: 30 credits of elective courses in psychology on advanced level at the Department of psychology (course offerings can vary from year to year)
- Block C: 30 credits of entirely elective courses
- Block D: Master's thesis (30 credits)

Boxes in purple and white are elective courses that our department offers, these course offerings can change from year to year but these are offerings you can expect for this academic year.

Sometimes there is a limited number of students in the electives indicated in white boxes because these courses are co read with another masters program in work and organizational psychology, we do not expect this to be an issue for Spring 25.

Boxes in blue are required or semi-required courses

Semi-required courses, means that you can take qualitative interviewing **and/or** applied questionnaire methods because this is an extra foundation course for your thesis

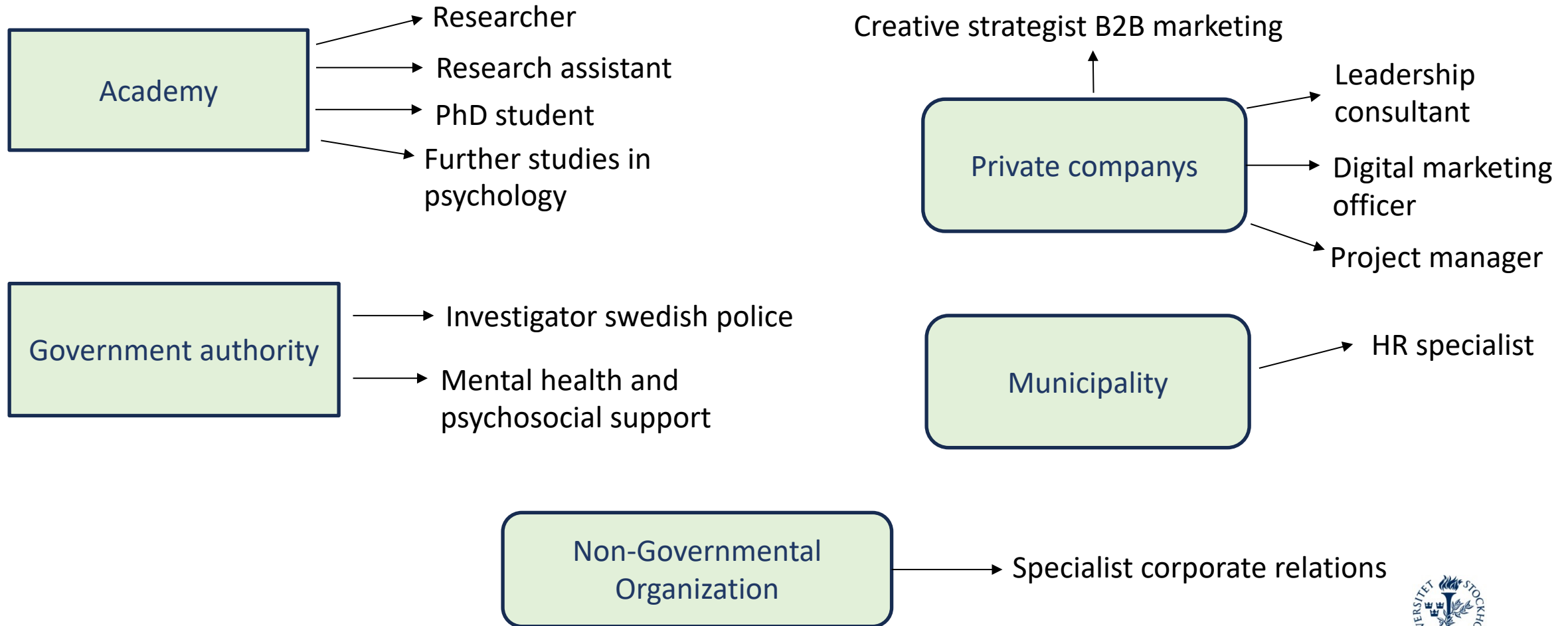
