***Policy for Degree Projects Written in a Foreign Language***

According to Stockholm University's *Language Policy for First-Cycle and Second-Cycle Studies* (the President's decision of 2011-09-29, Ref. no. SU 209-1772-10), the following rules shall apply:

*First-cycle education is primarily given in Swedish (education specifically aimed at foreign students is excluded). However, it is desirable that parts/components of the education/course are conducted in English or, where appropriate, in the language that is the objective/subject of the studies.*

*At the second-cycle level and in third-cycle education, English should be used to a greater extent than at the first-cycle level. Teaching may take place in English, in Swedish or in Swedish and English in parallel, or, where appropriate, in the language that is the objective/subject of the studies.*

There are no guidelines for the choice of language for degree projects, the general practice is that students whose native language is Norwegian, Danish or English are free to choose to write their degree projects in their native language. Other students who wish to write their work in another language are referred to their supervisor, who decides on a language choice. If the student and supervisor cannot agree on the language choice, SU's Language Policy and the established course syllabus shall apply; i.e. if the course is given in Swedish, the student must write her/his degree project in Swedish.
