Headword

I just came back from the field. That is, a long field weekend in Dublin. For more than 15 years I have been going back and forth between Stockholm and Dublin on yo-yo fieldwork - first for a study of dance and questions of memory and mobility, and now for a study of the social world of contemporary fiction writers. Both studies address issues on migration and diaspora, postcoloniality, and the cultural consequences of sudden economic prosperity followed by an even quicker downturn. On a methodological note, my longest stay has been only two weeks in Ireland, but added together these weeks by now make up about two years.

It has been said many times (but is still not accepted in all corners) that in order to keep up with the mobility and speed of contemporary social life, anthropology requires a "new" set of methods such as the practice of mobile and multi-sited fieldwork. Traditional fieldwork with one year or more or less uninterrupted participant observation in a village or an urban neighbourhood, is still there and necessary for certain research questions - and it may actually be useful with a longterm fieldwork as a first experience. For many research questions that come out of contemporary social life where so much is in motion, we need to be mobile and follow our interlocutors, their objects and ideas. Also, and no less importantly, we have to be ready to capture recurrent events (such as literary festivals and book launches in my current case) that occur regularly but infrequently. There is on the whole an obvious shift towards more flexible forms and methodological pluralism in anthropology. And more often than not, a field takes the form of a network.

So how did I spend my field weekend this time? Staying with my key writer-friend, I had many opportunities for productive conversation. She even arranged a dinner with three other writers. I did an interview with a mature debutante who recently published his memoir. Certain topics and names recurred over the days, such as that of a literary agent I had not heard about before. On the last day, I was in a pub with a writer. She greets a man who passes us. It turns out to be the missing literary agent. This kind of serendipity can spring up in a tightknit network such as the literary world in Dublin.



Back at the University, I attended a meeting for Heads of Departments at the Social Science faculty. We were informed about a remit from the Rector concerning the selection of new "Leading research areas" at Stockholm University. In order for the Department to be competitive for this - it is extremely important that you all submit your recent publications in DiVA no later than 1st March!

Finally, let me congratulate Renita Thedvall on becoming "Docent", Associate professor! Grattis!

Professor J. Lorand Matory, Lawrence Richardson Professor of Cultural Anthropology and Director, Center for African and African American Research, Duke University
»Marx, Freud and the Gods People Make in West Africa: the Lessons of the Real-Life 'Fetish' for European Theory«

Fetishism is one of the preeminent themes in the humanities and the social sciences, as well as one of the most exemplary habits of theory informed by the Atlantic slave trade and European imperialism. This illustrated discussion of African and Afro-Latin American sacred objects also calls attention to the social positionality from which Marx, Freud and their forebears--as far back as the 16th century--identified the human-made gods of Africa and Latin America as a metaphor of misplaced value, errant subjectivity, and bad governance. Based upon ethnographic research in Nigeria, Benin Republic, Democratic Republic of Congo, Brazil, Cuba and the Latin American diaspora in the US, this lecture shows that these gods and their makers would return the criticism, shedding new light upon a signature contribution of the Central European world to theory in the 20th century.

Professor Karsten Paerregaard, School of Global Studies, University of Gothenburg
»Anthropology and climate change: Global warming, water scarcity and the state in the Peruvian Andes«

Peru is the tropical country in the world with most glaciers. These make up a critical water source for its rural and urban population but due to global warming, they are melting in an alarming speed causing water scarcity and social conflicts in throughout country. Climate change is also leading to a reconfiguration of the powers that Andean population believes control their lives. In many parts of Andes, people believe that the mountains which supply them with melt water to irrigate the fields are inhabited by deities. To appease these and ask them for more water, people make annual offerings. This paper discusses how these offerings and the cosmological order they are part of change meaning as the glaciers and ice caps of the Andes are melting. It also examines how the power vacuum created by the cosmological transformation of Andean society is replaced by the State, which has strengthened its presence in the Andes in the past two decades. The paper argues that even though climate change generates water scarcity in many parts of Peru and thus represents a huge challenge for Peruvian society, it also paves the way for a new social and ideological order forged and controlled by

»Transnational connections and 'development' disconnections: stories from Sylhet, Bangladesh«



The metaphors of *connection* and its antonym, *disconnection* are a useful framing of discussions of migration. Indeed, a huge amount of work has been devoted to describing migration as enabled via connections in chains or networks, whilst the framing of transnationalism points directly to on-going relationships and connections between so-called 'receiving' and 'sending' countries. Yet if connections are made, these are inevitably accompanied by *disconnection*, in the form of ruptured relationships, loss and the yearning for an imagined 'home' that has been so well described in the literature on diaspora. In this paper I push the metaphor a little further, using it to think not only about migration, but the broader processes and conditions that structure everyday struggles and opportunities in places such as Bangladesh. What I hope to show is how whilst migration is enabled by *informal*, social connections, it can lead to *formal* connectedness, in which these informal, socially based links become less important, via citizenship and access to employment in the formal sector. From this, we can use the metaphor of connection to think more broadly about 'development' in its various guises. The paper is based on stories drawn from a place I'm calling Duniapur in Sylhet, NE Bangladesh, plus a brief sortie to Burnley, north east England. The setting is notable not only for its long history of transnational migration, but also because since 2007 the oil company Chevron has been operating a large gas plant there. It's also the place where I've been doing fieldwork, and visiting, since 1987.

Borders are a fact of human life; they may be visible or invisible, they may be about territories, symbols and morals.

We create borders to make sense of our world, to give it structure and meaning. At the same time, borders form a field of negotiations; borders are questioned, challenged, crossed and transformed. Individuals, groups and organizations, such as Läkare utan gränser, Journalister, Ingenjörer, and even Clowner utan gränser, are active in areas where borders may be problematic. However, all borders may not be problematic or pronounced. Sometimes they are hard to see for outsiders, in other cases their existence appears inevitable.

SANT 2014 wishes to see borders from an anthropological perspective. Pertinent questions are: how do anthropologists study borders, and what can anthropologist contribute to the understanding of borders, to the making of borders?

In times of globalization, activities of work are also becoming more global in nature and in particular they involve transnational migration flows. Nation states and international organisations, such as the EU, are examples of emerging global migration regimes, trying to monitor global work. The increasing mobility of people, who wish to improve their life situations, is another indication of the significance of global work. Recruitment agencies are brokering migrant workers, students are entering international universities and transnational firms are acting within global value chains. Some migrant workers enter the high end of the economy and are sometimes referred to as highly-skilled or career migrants, whereas others enter the low end of the economy, often suffering from exploitation and low earnings. The extensive student migration from India to the ICT firms in the US, South-Asian women doing domestic work in Singapore and Thai berry pickers in Sweden are all examples of global work – gendered and characterized by class and ethnic hierarchies in an evermore globalized labour market.

This workshop emphasizes how various forms of global work are closely linked to transnational migration processes. Webs of networks tie countries together, constituting a transnational social space, facilitating migration flows. The everyday practices of individual migrants are affected by these networks – and the simultaneous events taking place in the sending and receiving countries – and at the same time contribute to their continuation. There are hence many examples of how transnational migration processes and global work practices are interlinked: in globalized economies institutions develop global networks within which workers are recruited. These institutions can be transnational firms, global brokers or a network of families and friends. In the receiving society, transnational networks are often used in the labour market and transnational migrant entrepreneurs can use their contacts in their homeland to establish their business in the new country.

Deadline: February 27

All proposals must be made to specific panels via the 'Propose a paper' link found beneath the panel abstract on that panel's webpage. Proposals should consist of:

- a paper title
- authors/co-authors
- a short abstract of fewer than 300 characters
- a long abstract of fewer than 250 words.

On submission of the proposal, the proposing author (but not the co-authors) will receive an automated email confirming receipt. If you do not receive this email, please first check the Login environment - Cocoa (see toolbar above right) to see if your proposal is there. If it is, it simply means your confirmation email got spammed/lost; if it is not, you will need to re-submit, as for some reason the process was not completed. Subsequent communication will be with all authors of a paper.

Proposals will be marked as pending until the end of the Call for papers (27/02/2014). Convenors will then be asked to make their decisions over the papers proposed to their panel by 9th March and to communicate those to the proposers, marking them up within the login environment (Cocoa). Papers which are neither accepted nor rejected, but marked for 'transfer', will then be considered by the Scientific Committee to see where else they might fit in the conference programme. There is no guarantee that such papers can be re-housed. We aim to resolve all transfers by 10th April 2014.

While we cannot prevent you from making multiple proposals, we would encourage colleagues to make just one. The 'transfer process' aims to ensure that good papers will have a chance to be presented even if the panel to which they were initially proposed has no space.

The rules

- Delegates may only make one presentation. In addition to that they may also convene one plenary session, panel, or roundtable; and/or be discussant in

one plenary session, panel, or roundtable.

- All convenors and presenters must be members of EASA (during 2014), and have paid their subscription before the conference.
- But to propose a paper you do not need to be a member of EASA, and any decision taken about your proposal is not influenced by whether or not you currently are a member. If your paper is accepted you will need to become a member for 2014, via the online application form. Please do not apply until your paper has been accepted. Once you have applied we will contact your referees and then confirm your membership. This can take some time, so please be patient.

Language

EASA has two official languages, French and English. It is up to each panel's convenors to decide which languages will be used in that panel. Some convenors may be happy to accept presentations in the other language; to determine this you will have to email the convenors and ask. In such cases we would expect authors/presenters to bring a printed summary of their presentation in the primary language (EN or FR) for distribution within the workshop. Papers may not be presented in a third language.

Vid registrering av en publikation i DiVA bör man först kontrollera att publikationen inte redan registrerats, i syfte att undvika duplikat i databasen.

Studenterna möter fortfarande få professorer

Högskolans mest vetenskapligt meriterade lärare står för mindre än hälften av undervisningen och forskningen. Till exempel utför professorerna bara åtta procent av undervisningen på grundnivå och avancerad nivå. Universitetskanslersämbetet har undersökt hur lärare och forskare fördelar sin arbetstid mellan undervisning och forskning. Rapporten, som bygger på SCB:s statistik, visar att högskolans verksamhet numera är mer inriktad på forskning än den var när samma studie gjordes 2007.

Universitetet visar positivt resultat för 2013

Stockholms universitet visar ett positivt resultat på 345 miljoner kronor för år 2013. Samtidigt står universitetet inför stora investeringar de närmaste åren.

Den 18 februari antog styrelsen vid Stockholms universitet årsredovisningen för år 2013. I likhet med föregående år visar universitetet ett positivt resultat. Överskottet för 2013 blev 345 miljoner, mot 50 miljoner för 2012. Resultatet fördelar sig med 312 miljoner inom anslaget för utbildning på grundläggande och avancerad nivå (UGA) och 33 miljoner inom forskning och utbildning på forskarnivå (FUF). Detta innebär även att universitetets sparade medel (myndighetskapitalet) var drygt en miljard kronor vid årsskiftet.

The non-government and voluntary sector, ICT, and democracy

Deadline: March 1

The recent award of the Nobel Peace Prize to the Organi-sation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons has again focused international public attention on the role and im-portance of Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) in social and political life. NGOs, together with other groups which rely to a greater or lesser extent on volunteers such as Local Voluntary Organisations (LVOs) often provide services to the community and undertake tasks which government cannot or will not do.

The nature, scale and activities of NGOs and LVOs vary enormously both within countries and across countries. In countries with highly developed and extensive welfare states, which include many European countries, the role of NGOs and voluntary or part voluntary organisations will be different than it will be in, say, countries like the USA or in the developing world. Such organisations range from well-funded, well-resourced and formally struc-tured international organisations such as the Red Cross or the World Wildlife Fund to small local, even ad hoc, loose networks of individuals organised around anything from fund raising for the local school to community gardening or even crowdsourcing.

The field of Community Informatics is one in which the use of ICT by LVOs and similar organisations is studied, but there has been little research to date on how and to what extent organisations across this spectrum use ICT for member or citizen engagement and the promotion of internal democratic governance.

For this special issue we are seeking contributions from interdisciplinary research that examines, in different ways, how volunteer spheres use the tools of e-democracy, i.e. how they use ICT to strengthen the organisation's internal democratic structures. We are also calling for applied studies such as usability or design studies of the deve-lopment of tools for e-democracy for non-governmental organisations. A majority of research in this area is carried

out in English-speaking countries and in urban settings, which is why we welcome studies from other perspectives.

- Studies of the use of e-democracy tools in NGOs and LVOs;
- Evaluations of commonly used open-source systems in NGOs and citizen engagement, from a democracy perspective;
- Technology-enhanced cooperation in NGOs and LVOs;
- Use of technology for lobbying and mobilizing campaigns;
- ICT support for knowledge management in NGOs and LVOs;
- On-line democratic culture;
- Processes of inclusion and exclusion in e-participation;
- ICT and gender equality in NGOs and LVOs;
- ICT supported organization of global democratic movements;
- Security issues in tools and practices for e-democracy in NGOs and LVOs;
- The use of or potential for e-voting in NGOs and LVOs;
- Use of pseudonyms in e-citizen engagement;
- Anonymity and e-democracy;
- The sociology of ICT use in such organizations;
- ICT impacts on the internal democratic processes in NGOs and LVOs;
- Comparative studies of NGOs ICT supported communication practices;
- ICT supported interaction between NGOs;
- NGOs internal democratic norms and practices in relation to ICT;
- Case studies of models and prototypes in e-democracy/e-engagement projects in NGOs and LVOs.

Revisiting 'doing gender': Language and gender in interaction May 6-8, 2014, University of Karlstad, Sweden Deadline: March 7, 2014

Course description:

This course centers on exploring key aspects of the relationships between language, gender, and social interaction. Current and earlier debates in the area of language, gender and interaction are revisited with a focus both on the commonalities and differences between different approaches. Providing methodological discussions and illustrative examples on how researchers go about collecting and analyzing data, the overreaching focus of the course is how gender issues and other forms of inequalities have been addressed in recent discourse research. We will pay particular attention to research on language and sexuality, enactments of differences, and on interactional accomplishments of gender in various settings. A core idea behind the research examined is the ethnomethodological concept of 'doing gender' that had been present in some form since mid-seventies and firmly established during the 1990s.

The course will, firstly, investigate the relationship between language and gender, both theoretically and empirically. Secondly, the course encompasses research using an ethnomethodological and conversation analytic approach in the study of identity and interaction. The course is aimed at doctoral students in gender studies and related fields, suitable for anyone with an interest in how gender is 'done' in language and embodied action.

Lovene fortæller os, hvad vi må og ikke må, og indenfor institutioner, nationalstater, religioner, unioner og globale organisationer skaber love et net af forskrifter for, hvordan og hvornår praksis er lovlig og ulovlig. For at en lov kan eksistere, skal den både forestilles, praktiseres og forhandles. Bridging cultures, national, organizational, occupational and other, is an integral theme in the literature on workforce diversity. It suggests the need to recognize, support and utilize worker's cultural diversity and to consider how culture intertwines with other identity markers such as gender, age, disability and sexual orientation. But it also refers to organizations' need to adapt to a multicultural context. The composition of the workforce changed during the last decades and organizations have to handle national and global cultural changes. Moreover, the historical and socio-political context of organizations embeds a peculiar local flavor to diversity management that diverges from the prevalent orthodoxies of universal diversity management. Different actors and groups may be able to use the concept of diversity management strategically to negotiate improvements in status, position or voice in organizations.

To grapple with such developments requires a critical examination of the concepts of diversity and identity and of diversity management practices. What does the concept of diversity entail (Konrad et al., 2006) and how does it relate to identity markers like gender, race, sexuality, nationality and religion? What does diversity management mean in different contexts (Klarsfeld, 2010) and how does it contribute to the recognition of diverse identities and the articulation of marginal voices? Differential power between social identity groups remains unacknowledged in the business case for diversity. In what way do diversity management practices address these power differentials and the simultaneity of processes of social identity (Holvino, 2010)?

We invite theoretical as well as empirical papers that make visible different forms of discrimination, exclusion, resistance and empowerment, and that critically examine the concepts of diversity and identity as well as diversity management practices.

All submissions for the special issue will be subject to full peer review. Submission will be taken to imply that a paper contains original work that has not previously been published and is not under consideration for publication elsewhere. Authors should follow the journal's regular guidelines, as published in every issue of the journal. Papers should be no longer than 6,000 words (including references, tables, etc.)

For the third edition of its annual summer school, the Mnemonics network, an international collaborative initiative for graduate education in memory studies, invites paper proposals that address the relations between media and cultural memory.

The study of cultural memory is increasingly focusing on the often conflicting, overlapping, fractured, flexible, and dynamic nature of processes of remembrance. This emphasis on the mobility of memory makes the study of the media of memory an urgent task; as memories of the past are always constructed in ongoing processes of remediation, they are subject to the possibilities and constraints of medial carriers. The archiving of vast amounts of data is, for instance, impossible in oral cultures; television and photography, for their part, have enabled more visceral modes of connectedness, while the increased retrievability of the past in a digital age has paradoxically also inspired forms of public amnesia. Questions about media of memory have become all the more urgent through the rise of digital media, which has enabled media platforms like YouTube, Twitter, and Facebook to generate transnational as well as vernacular memory communities.

The summer school welcomes paper proposals that explore the interface of media and memory. Possible topics include, but are emphatically not restricted to:

- How do particular older as well as newer media serve as memory agents—as cues, catalysts, storage media?

- What novel forms of memory community and agency do new media make possible?
- How do particular media constrain communities' abilities to remember and forget?
- What is the division of labor between different local and global media?
- How do new media affect issues surrounding the control, the unequal accessibility, and the ownership of memory?
- How does the study of memory respond to recent medial developments? What is the role of, for instance, digital humanities in this new research context?

By providing funds for scholars to devote themselves to full-time work on a research-related film, the Foundation aims to enable a new generation of scholars to present their work

via this medium. Broadly speaking, we seek to support projects that will have an impact on the field of anthropology -- as well as outreach beyond the academy -- through the support of exciting new and innovative work in the field of ethnographic film.

The fellowship is named after Paul Fejos, who was an early ethnographic film maker (1935-1941) and the first director of the Wenner-Gren Foundation (1941-1963). He was an innovator in his time and in honor of Fejos' legacy, we encourage innovation in film making in terms of process, formal approaches, and the integration of film/video with other forms relevant to visual anthropology (e.g. social media, web-based platforms, crowd-sourced production, and other media platforms that offer new ways of developing outreach to diverse communities). Because »innovation« is more than simply the way things look on screen or the use of social media, the Fejos Fellowship encourages new approaches to the ethics of representing diverse social worlds through a public form, and to rights to materials and copyright.

Fejos Postdoctoral Fellowships are nonrenewable, and provide US \$40,000 of financial support for twelve months of continuous full-time work on the project. Applicants requesting shorter time periods will receive a pro-rated award as appropriate (e.g., a six-month project would be awarded \$20,000). It is Foundation policy that Institutional Overhead or Institutional Support is not covered under this fellowship. Applicants can apply regardless of institutional affiliation, country of residence, or nationality.

The socioenvironmental state: towards a political ecology of state formation and environmental change

Andrea Nightingale is a geographer from Edinburgh and has recently taken up a post in Gothenburg at the School of Global Studies.

In this paper, I develop the idea of the 'socio-environmental state' to understand how 'nature' or 'environment' is an active agent in state formation. I begin with the question what is 'the state'? How does it operate, and most importantly, how do resources and their 'nature' shape the possibilities of state transformation not only ecologically but also politically? The paper takes the case

of forests in Nepal to probe how environmental governance is bound up in state ambitions of conflicting groups. The kinds of relationships believed to be required for good environmental management are absolutely fundamental to how states and state-like actors seek to promote particular ideas of citizenship and to unite and control their populations. The argument builds from four core literatures: work on state formation in geography and anthropology; new work in development studies on property, authority and citizenship; political ecology; and feminist theory. This theoretical synthesis helps capture the emergence of political subjectivities, imaginaries and biophysical-ecological transformations from projects intended to improve the material base of the state. As such, these projects serve to quite literally build the state, offering important insights into processes of state transformation.

In this presentation Chantal Mouffe will examine the recent Occupy movements in order to grasp the nature of the challenge that they pose to representative democracy. Gender Essentialism in Cross-National Perspective

Karin Halldén, Stockholms universitet

The "gender revolution" is a half-century old, yet gender inequality and segregation remain more resistant to change than many forms of racial and class inequality.

We show that gender segregation is extreme because in all countries it has a strong essentialist foundation. The perniciousness of essentialism has been underappreciated because prior segregation research has focused mainly on its more benign female-advantaging variant.

We find that a full model of essentialism, one that incorporates both the female-advantaging and male-advantaging variants, provides a powerful account of segregation in all 25 countries examined here. We also show that the essentialist component of inequality is durable in the sense that it's resistant to liberal egalitarian interventions.

Neither in the academy nor in popular discourse are descriptions of "cultures" neutral reports. Prof. J. Lorand Matory, Center for African and African American Research at Duke University, examines the re-articulation of ethnic boundaries and cultural diacritica by which African and Caribbean immigrants to the United States, as well as by Louisiana Creoles of color and Native American populations of partly African descent, who endeavor to distinguish themselves from a supposedly more prototypical black American, with the intent to establish their worthiness of the American dream. Such cultural self-construction in contrast to the stigmatized African American is taken as a case study of the role of stigma in the genesis of cultural identities generally, a role that is particularly evident in a time of global migrations.

Beyond "Good and Bad": A Corrective Analysis of the Phe- nomenon of the Jewish Councils during the Nazi Era

The Lecture will be given by Professor Dan Michman, professor of Modern Jewish History at Bar-Ilan University, Israel. One of Israel's most prominent Holocaust historians, Michman holds the chair of Bar-Ilan's Finkler Institute of Holocaust Research, and is also director, and John Najmann Chair of Yad Vashem's International Institute of Holocaust Research, Jerusalem. Michman has published extensively on a wide range of subjects within both Holocaust history and memory. His most recent monograph is *The Emergence of Jewish Ghettos during the Holocaust* (Cambridge University Press 2011). In it, Michman argues for a significant reinterpretation of long-held understandings of the role and rationality of the Jewish ghettos – formed within Nazi-occupied Eastern Europe.

Michman will discuss a subject intimately connected to the ghettos: the infamous Jewish Councils (Judenräte). These groups constituted one of the most controversial aspects of Nazi occupation policy, and have been the subject of intense debate ever since. The lecture focusses on the establishment and implementation of the councils and how they evolved in different Jewish communities throughout Europe and even North Africa, and discusses in whose interest the councils and significant elements of them were effected.

The Nordic Africa Days (NAD) is the biannual conference of the Nordic Africa Institute organised for the past 15 years in the Nordic Countries, with participants representing the state of the art in African Studies and Africa related knowledge production.

The Nordic Africa Days 2014 has a thematic focus on different assumptions of governance. It cuts across research topics covering most African developments and processes, including, but not restricted to, conflict, security and democratic transformations; rural and agrarian changes, properties and resources; urban dynamics; and African international links in the global world. It is thus clearly multidisciplinary. This theme goes beyond the common reading of governance in political science or international relations. It aims to connect the formal state with other non-state forms of governance. Often, the state is discussed as an evil entity preying on its ethical citizens. Citizens are then described as the victims of state power. But are states not run by the same people that, looking at it from the opposite angle, are viewed as victims?

The conference is particularly inviting panels discussing governance in different ways. The suggested panels should not just be looking at the state structures and sub-national government levels, but also at the formulation and governance in alternative structures such as ethnic and religious groups and socio-economic networks, which may at times compete and at times cooperate with state orchestrated governance.

Contributions focusing on measuring and assessing governance and discussing criteria for governance and leadership are also especially encouraged.

PhD candidates and other young scholars are strongly encouraged to participate in the conference. The conference aims to be a forum for academic exchange and intellectual development, where contributions from a new generation of researchers are important and welcome. The conference also provides a venue for dialogue between Africa specialists within academic and policy arenas.

Panel abstracts should include a description of the topic not exceeding 300 words, list of potential presenters and titles of papers, as well as name and contact details of the panel organizer. Panel organizers are expected to be the chair of their panels and should present a paper. A person can only propose one panel and present one paper at the conference.

Social Media and the Transformation of Public Space

June 18-20, 2014, University of Amsterdam, Netherlands

Deadline: March 7

The quick rise of social platforms, such as Facebook, Twitter, YouTube and LinkedIn, is fundamentally affecting the balance

between personal (private) space, community (public) space, and corporate (commercial) space. These platforms allow, on the one hand, for mass participation in public discourse, providing users with new means of expressions and connection. In this light, it has been argued that social media bring about a democratization of public life: facilitating novel forms of political contestation, more participatory types of journalism, and direct interaction between citizens and political and cultural elites. On the other hand, social media, through their technological architectures, steer how users interact with each other. They penetrate deeply in the dynamics of everyday life, reshaping people's informal personal interactions, but also affecting institutional structures and professional routines. In this process, both public and private communication becomes entangled with social media's commercial mechanisms, transforming the political economy of the media landscape. In combination, these developments force all societal actors, including the mass media, civil society organizations, and state institutions, to reconsider and recalibrate their position in public space.

This conference explores the potentially contradictory cultural and techno-commercial mechanisms introduced by the rise of social media platforms. The organizers invite research from different perspectives and traditions to reflect on this issue. First, we invite work that interrogates how both formal institutions (news, public broadcasting, law and order, etc) and informal organizations (activists, communities) adopt and adjust to social media. What new cultural and political practices are articulated in these processes? Second, we encourage technological perspectives: presentations of scholarship examining which mechanisms of selection and which logics of knowledge production are embedded in the platforms' technologies. Third, the conference solicits economic and political perspectives: how do social media affect the operations and economies of media production? And how do these technologies affect power relations between different social actors?

The main question driving this conference is how social media, looked at from different angles and scholarly approaches, are transforming concepts of public space or "publicness". More particularly, we will ask how social media are involved in the transformation of particular domains, including news production, public broadcasting, activism, and law and order. Examples of possible topics follow below.

The Politics of Legality in a Neo-liberal Age
August 1-2, University of New South Wales Law School,
Sydney, Australia
Deadline: March 28

This symposium will examine the nexus between the political dominance of liberal legal ideas and the economic dominance of neo-liberal capitalism.

According to classical liberal theory the state is legitimate to the extent that it respects legality. The idea that the state should respect individual rights and the rule of law continues to have considerable purchase on our political discourse: the language of human rights is used by NGOs to criticise state violence, and by the same states to justify the violence of military interventions; those concerned with the legal response to terrorism often invoke the rule of law to criticise the expansion of powers for the executive branch of government; while the very same executive pays meticulous attention to justifying actions such as torture in legal terms. Indeed, law is so central to the contemporary political imagination that the theorist Norberto Bobbio has dubbed our time the ‘age of rights’. Economically, however, the age in which we live is that of neo-liberal capitalism. The critique of the regulatory state and the advocacy of the ‘free market’ developed by neo-liberal thinkers such as Frederich Hayek, Milton Friedman, and Ludwig von Mises have had a serious impact on practices of government over the last 30 years. Indeed, it has been argued that neo-liberalism has played a major role in the concentration of economic power in this time, profoundly influencing the policies that have shaped the course of economic globalisation; those that led to Global Financial Crisis of 2008; and the politics of austerity that has characterised the state response to this crisis in the US and the EU.

Neo-liberalism is not, however, simply an economic theory but a political philosophy that has legality at its core, defining itself against the regulatory state for violating individual liberty and advocating private property rights and a certain vision of the rule of law as crucial to the functioning of capitalist economies. The rule of law has also been central to the processes of neo-liberal globalisation with ‘rule of law promotion’ playing a crucial role in developing markets in the global South. And, while human rights are often used as tools for political critique and resistance, the historian Samuel Moyn has illustrated that the language of human rights has colonised political discourse since the late 1970s. This is the very same period in which neo-liberalism has restructured the relationship between economy and society and state, raising the

question of whether there is a relationship between these two phenomena.

This symposium will address this conjuncture through papers which engage, among a range of other possibilities, the following themes and topics:

- What is neo-liberalism (a radical economic theory, a political philosophy, a governmental practice, a theory of the enterprising subject, a mutation in the history of liberalism)? How can we best understand and historicize the concept, and what set of theoretical analyses best sheds light on its contemporary operations?
- What transformations has the neo-liberal era wrought to the state, its function, its operation, its ideological mode of presentation and legitimization?
- What role specifically do law and legal ideas perform in undergirding and reinforcing neo-liberalism as a political and economic project?
- What is the relationship between the critique of totalitarianism and the ideological defence of neo-liberalism? How can we think differently about the relation between state repression and the neo-liberal economic project?
- How does the discourse surrounding the ‘rule of law’ and its promotion, especially in the global South, reinforce neo-liberalism? How might the rule of law, or aspects of the rule of law tradition, interrupt or restrain neo-liberal capitalism?
- What is the relation between the discourse of human rights and neo-liberalism – historically, conceptually, and politically? How do human rights actors and institutions recreate (or oppose) neo-liberal hegemony?
- What critical or emancipatory purchase, if any, do traditional liberal legal ideas (such as accountability, the separation of the political and the economic, the restraint of arbitrary power) still have in a neo-liberal context?
- What relevance do the classic critiques of these liberal legal ideas (of legal objectivity and neutrality, of formalism, and of the commodity form in particular, etc.) have to our neo-liberal present? Do they perform the same work? What work might they do? How might we reframe or update them to take account of changed political-economic circumstances?
- What prospects are there for legal resistance to contemporary forms of neo-liberalism? What might a strategic left response to neo-liberalism look like – a defence of the protections of the welfare state, or the creation of something new?

Publication Plans: Whilst we do not require full length papers in advance of the symposium, the aim of our meeting is to work towards the publication of selected papers in an edited volume. Initial negotiations with interested publishers are already underway.

There is an increasing interest in analyzing markets as organized phenomena. To this conference we invite papers to be presented and discussed on various aspects of market organization such as forms of market organization, how markets are re-organized, the organizing attempts of various market organizers and the effects of market organization. Both empirical and theoretical papers are welcome.

Keynote speaker: Neil Fligstein, University of California, Berkeley.

Markets are sometimes described as alternatives to organizations. But markets and organization may also go well together – typically markets are highly organized phenomena. The order in markets is not only created by processes of mutual adjustment between sellers and buyers (as described in economics) or by common institutions (as emphasized in market sociology); market order is also created by organization. This is easy to see when markets are organized as formal organizations, for instance as stock exchanges. But also markets outside formal organizations are organized, at least to some extent.

Markets attract many organizers. Some of these actors set standards for products, production processes, or for how sellers shall organize themselves. Others monitor sellers or buyers, for instance how they comply to standards or other rules or their financial situation. Yet others, use various forms of sanctions, such as awards or boycotts. Trade organizations and others offer membership to market actors and sometimes hierarchical authority can be used for enforcing rules, monitoring and membership. Sellers, buyers, social movements, various mediators and states are all actual or potential market organizers.

Processes and consequences of market organization are different from processes and consequences of mutual adjustment or institutionalization. Theories that have been developed for understanding formal organizations may be useful for understanding markets as well, and more specifically to understand how markets are organized.

For this conference we invite papers on aspects of market organization. For instance, the papers may discuss the role of organization in creating markets, how markets are re-organized, the organizing attempts of various market organizers and the effects of market organization. Both empirical and theoretical papers are welcome.

Papers may, but must not, include any of the more specific themes listed below:

- Evolving views of and approaches to markets – from free markets to pure markets?
- Value conflicts in market organization
- The organization of legitimate markets: Transparency, measurability, and accountability
- Crises, markets and organization
- Standardization as market organization

The process of submission will be in two steps: first an abstract of approximately 300 words should be submitted. All abstracts will be reviewed for relevance and quality. Authors whose abstracts are accepted will be invited to send in a full paper. Please submit your abstract and manuscript by email to info@score.su.se. The 11th IMISCOE Annual Conference will address the links between migration, social cohesion and social innovation in globalised, transnational spaces. Immigrants in Europe have been seriously affected by the economic downturn. Rising unemployment has caused labour and income insecurity and led to long-term vulnerability, particularly for families of immigrant origin. At the same time, public policies aimed at immigrant integration have undergone adjustment and faced budget constraints, and public debates revolving around their redefinition have questioned their effectiveness, management and scope.

The new and more hostile environment has affected not only publicly provided immigrant-targeted services, but has also impacted those supplied by NGOs (devoted to immigrants or not) which had customarily maintained strong financial and institutional links with the State. Together with the economic crisis, the resulting gap in service provision could increase ethnic segmentation processes, ultimately threatening social cohesion. Within this context, social innovation can emerge as a potential solution to the pressing issues immigrants are confronted with.

Material Matters in Times of Crisis Capitalism: Transnational Feminist and Decolonial Approaches

The question of materiality has emerged as a central topic in studies concerned with the body, affect, sexuality, bio-politics and digital culture in recent years. Under the umbrella term »new materialism«, this interdisciplinary and multifaceted academic debate seems to have revived a Marxist vocabulary. Yet, the question of why »materiality« matters in times of crisis capitalism is rather absent in this debate.

This conference takes up this question by focusing on why and how materiality matters in times of crisis capitalism. Starting from the assumption that crisis is not exceptional in capitalism but its constant companion and that it represents the foundation from which the modern/colonial world system has evolved, this conference draws on critical feminist economics and decolonial feminist thought and practice on material matters.

The 2007/2008 financial crash led to the re-assembling or dismantling of the welfare state in Western Europe and the reordering of old global economic interdependencies. While the rise of China, India and Brazil as emerging economic world powers highlights the flexible potential of capitalist expansion, the increasing gap between rich and poor globally denotes

the stagnation and decline of an economic system guided by the financial interest of a selected few. Social protests from Tahri Square (Cairo) to Puerta de Sol (Madrid) to Taksim Square (Istanbul) to Rio de Janeiro have shown that the financial crisis cannot be reduced solely to its economic dimension.

These protests have foregrounded the social and cultural dimensions of the crisis of capitalism. Located between struggles for common wealth and the reorganization of production and reproduction, crisis capitalism refers to processes of social transformation changing and challenging people's livelihood, which in turn impact on their well-being, health, education, housing and working conditions. Indeed, we are witnessing multiple crises. It is in this context that this conference calls for transnational feminist analyses of materiality at the juncture of global political economy and coloniality.

The conference has three inter-related aims: first, to examine from transnational feminist perspectives the impact of the global crisis on people's livelihoods; second, to explore the theoretical contributions of the triad of feminism, coloniality and political economy; and, third, to consider critical feminist economics and decolonial approaches to thinking alternative economies and convivial futures.

In this spirit we have invited key contemporary thinkers, who have linked academic work to political activism and social intervention. Confirmed keynote speakers for the conference include:

Southern Africa beyond the West:

Political, Economic & Cultural Relationships with the BRICS & the Global South

Journal of Southern African Studies 1st Biennial Conference

August 7-10, 2015, Livingstone, Zambia

Deadline: August 1

The primary aim of the conference will be to consider Southern Africa's place in a future world in which the influence of Western powers is in relative decline. To this end it will focus on social, political and cultural aspects of the region's relationships with other regions, including the Lusophone world, China, India, Russia and their spheres of influence, as well as examples of South-South linkages, recognising at the outset that what are presented as new linkages have a long history.

We will be seeking papers on:

- China's changing role in Southern Africa, inclusive of the historical period of support for liberation movements, economic development assistance and diplomacy, and of the contemporary period related to increased investment and activity, as well as forms of cultural and demographic circulation;
- The Indian Ocean World and Southern Africa, inclusive of Swahili, Arab and Asiatic influences, and Madagascar and India, including shifts in the way India interacted with Africa: first through ancient long distance trade routes, then as a source of migrant labour under British colonialism, then as a non-aligned nation and now as a more contemporary India, which is "competing" with China economically and in other spheres;
- Brazil's relationships with Southern Africa, focusing on its increasing weight in the world economy, including its links with Portugal and the Lusophone African countries, with a Portuguese-centred reconsideration of the Southern African region's pre/colonial history of exploration, missionary activity, trade and colonisation, and decolonisation and war; as well as current religious movements and forms of cultural, economic, political and demographic circulation across the Lusophone world;
- Russia, as the most debatable member of the BRICS, still represents a nation with a long history of interaction with Southern Africa, including support for liberation movements, as well as examples of technical cooperation and demographic circulation and networks still active today;
- South Africa and other emerging southern African economies: Angola, Mozambique, Zambia, Botswana, in addition to regional organisations and corporate linkages, especially South Africa's hegemony over construction and consumer goods in much of the region (think: the ubiquitous South African shopping mall), as well as long-standing white-settler labour issues common throughout the region and further forms of cultural, economic, political and demographic circulation and networks.
