

Fertility, Female Employment and Reconciliation Policies

This project is linked to RECWOWE (<http://recwowe.eu/>), a Network of Excellence of the Sixth Framework Programme (FP6) on 'Reconciling Work and Welfare in Europe'. We seek to shed more light on the role of increased labour market flexibility and the presence of reconciliation policies for women combining family and employment in relation to different fertility regimes across Europe in the early 21st century. We focus on six European countries (Sweden, France, Germany, Spain, Poland and Hungary), highlighting the impact of specific policies and welfare regime configurations on women's capabilities to have a family and care for children.
