# Bolin Centre Research Area 3 Call 2020 - now open!



## Aim

All projects with a research purpose related to the Bolin Centre Reserach Area 3, RA3 theme of Hydrology, Cryosphere and Climate are welcome to apply. Note that this

theme includes all aspects of the cryosphere and freshwater hydrology and water resources, including domains such as contaminants and other substances transported by surface and subsurface waters, as long as there is a clear climate relevance.

## **Potential projects**

Fieldwork, sampling, analyses, equipment, cost related to hire a student or field assistant for not more than one month, conferences, workshops or visits of external researchers. In the case of salaries, an overhead of 20% can be assumed.

The funds can also go towards co-funding and reinforcing projects funded by other Bolin Centre research areas if added value and RA3 relevance can be clearly demonstrated.

#### Available funding

The total budget of the call is approximately 400,000 SEK. The budget for proposed projects should be for no more than 100,000 SEK.

### **Eligible applicants**

The main applicant should be a member of RA3 and be employed at SU, KTH or  $\mathsf{SMHI}.$ 

#### Format of proposals

The competitive proposal should fit within maximum of two pages and should contain a project background and motivation, a description of relevance for RA3, a project plan, expected output and a budget. Font Times New Roman 10, single-spaced. No CV:s or publication lists are to be submitted.


#### **Evaluation**

Proposals will be evaluated based on (1) scientific quality, (2) relevance to the scope of RA3 and (3) effort to build new collaborations within the Bolin Centre. The applications will be evaluated by the RA leaders.

#### **Submission**

Send proposals as a single pdf file to <a href="mailto:fernando.jaramillo@natgeo.su.se">fernando.jaramillo@natgeo.su.se</a> at the latest on February 15, 2020. Decisions will be announced by March 1.

# NEW RESEARCH FROM THE BOLIN CENTRE



How AI will affect UN goals for climate, development and global stability

Artificial intelligence (AI) represents a powerful but double-edged sword as nations confront global warming, poverty and issues of peace and justice. An international team of scientists, led by Ricardo Vinuesa from KTH, released a first-ever study of how AI can help (as well as hinder) sustainable development worldwide. Published in Nature Communications, the analysis focuses on how AI impacts the 17 goals for sustainable development adopted by the United Nations in 2015. The research results as a whole show that 134 of these targets could benefit from AI, while another 59 goals would not.

# CALL OPEN - Transnational Access to marine labs in Europe (AssemblePlus)

The European project ASSEMBLE Plus offers Transnational Access, where researchers and PhD students can apply for support to conduct research at one of more than 30 marine stations distributed over 16 countries. This call gives the opportunity to gain access to a wide array of technologies and services in the fields of marine science. The TA funding covers travel, accommodation, and free-of-charge access to labs, research services, and standard disposables (but not researcher's salaries).

In Finland, Tvärminne Zoological Station (University of Helsinki), the Archipelago Research Institute in Seili (University of Turku) and Husö biological station (Åbo Akademi University) offer access. Finnish researchers cannot apply for access to the Finnish stations, but are encouraged to apply for access to some of the other partner institutions

This call closes on the 9th of February 2020 and it covers access from April to September 2020.

If you wish to apply, please check out <u>how the different Access Providers can serve</u> your research needs»

The application process involves submitting a short proposal that specifies the scientific context of your research, a research plan, and why you have chosen the specific access provider. You are expected to contact the Access Provider of your choice to explore the feasibility of your project, prior to submitting the proposal.
