The Bolin Centre is a multi-disciplinary consortium of over 350 scientists in Sweden that conducts research and graduate education related to the Earth's climate.




New Nature Communications article - Permafrost warming at a global scale



During the last decade permafrost temperatures have increased by 0,3 $^{\circ}$ C globally, according to a <u>study in Nature Communications</u> based on data from more than 150 boreholes in Arctic, Antarctic and mountain permafrost.

- If the permafrost warming continues at this high speed it can have severe impacts on ecosystems and infrastructure in the circumpolar region. Permafrost thaw can also result in large emissions of greenhouse gases (both carbon dioxide and methane) to the atmosphere, which further can accelerate the global warming, says Britta Sannel, Bolin Centre scientist, senior lecturer at the Department of Physical Geography at Stockholm University, and co-author of this study.
