The Bolin Centre is a multi-disciplinary consortium of over 350 scientists in Sweden that conducts research and graduate education related to the Earth's climate.



## **Arctic Avenue**

A new 3year spearhead project in the existing collaboration between the University of Stockholm (SU) and the University of Helsinki (UH) has been funded. The project is named Arctic Avenue and is led by Nina Kirchner (SU) and Atte Korhola (UH) and involves Bolin Centre members at SU, as well as researchers at UH connected to the Ecosystems and Environmental Research Programme of the Faculty of Biological and Environmental Sciences, HELSUS (Helsinki Institute of Sustainability Science), the Institute of Atmospheric and Earth System Research (INAR), the Dept. of Physics and the Dept. of Geosciences and Geography. Arctic Avenue aims to establish a strong and continuing research platform, serving as an attractive hub and umbrella for Arctic research connecting different disciplines in focusing on a broad range of topics of relevance for Arctic climate and ecosystems. The project is funded with a total of 6 MSEK, split evenly between SU and HU.

The Arctic Avenue Kick-off meeting will be held on March 27-28 in Helsinki, please save the date! More information to come.

### Participation support for Bolin Centre PhD students

Bolin Centre Climate Research School (CRS) provides financial support to PhD students to participate in climate related conferences and courses. There are two calls per year with deadlines 1 March and 1 October. To apply for support you need to:

- Be a PhD student
- Be a member of the Bolin Centre
- Participate in a course or present at a conference related to climate
- Have your supervisor's support for going in writing (an email will do, but include it in the application)
