Today, March 21, the Swedish Climate Policy Council presents their first report. The Council is part of the Swedish Climate Policy Framework and has the role to evaluate the work of the government in relation to the national climate targets; net zero emissions by 2045 and 70% reduction of emissions in the transport sector by 2030. The report will be presented at [a press conference](#) at 10.00 and then formally handed to the Vice Prime Minister Isabella Lövin at 13.00 in conjunction with an open seminar.
