## Reminder: Welcome to the Bert Bolin Lecture on Climate Research 2019



The Bert Bolin Lecture on Climate Research is given annually to commemorate professor Bert Bolin and his pioneering work for climate research at Stockholm University and internationally. The speaker is selected among prominent scientists within climate research by the Faculty of Science. Maureen E. Raymo will give this years lecture. She is a renowned scientist who has been a pioneer in the study of ice ages and sea level in Earth's history. Her work has shaped our understanding of Earth's natural climate variability and her landmark papers have influenced a generation of scientists. In 2014, Professor Raymo, a fellow of the National Academy of Sciences, the Explorers Club, and the American Geophysical Union, became the first woman to be awarded the Wollaston Medal, the Geological Society of London's most senior medal and highest accolade.

Professor Raymo will give both a science seminar and the Bert Bolin Climate Lecture. Fika will be served. Welcome!
