Climate change mitigation project threatens local ecosystem resilience in Ethiopia

Increasing forest cover in order to mitigate climate change does not always have positive effects, as shown in a new study undertaken in southern Ethiopia. It can also threaten biodiversity and the survival of unique alpine plants. - It is somehow ironic that a REDD+ project created to mitigate climate change globally, might substantially reduce climate resilience locally, says Maria Johansson, researcher at the Bolin Centre and Department of Ecology, Environment and Plant Science at Stockholm University.
