The Bolin Centre Research Area 4 "Biogeochemical Cycles and Climate" invites new research proposals. We seek to fund two different types of projects during 2018–2019. One category is Innovation Projects of clear demonstrated novelty, with a potential risk, but high gain. The second category is Consolidation Projects, which
