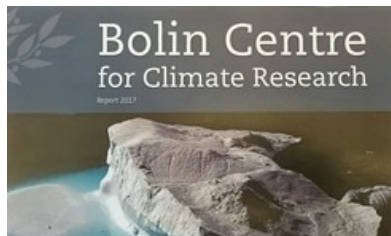
Places left on PhD courses

Expedition explores climate history of remote Arctic islands

On the 19th of August, an eight-days expedition on M/V Stålbas departed from Longyearbyen, Svalbard for Seven Islands (Sjuøjdane) and Storøya, small islands north of Nordaustlandet, Svalbard. The expedition includes researchers from The Bolin Centre, the University Centre in Svalbard (UNIS), Lund University, the University of Tromsø and KTH Royal Institute of Technology, in addition to a group of students from nine countries studying the "Arctic Late Quaternary Glacial and Marine Environmental History" course at UNIS.
