researchers to previously unexplored areas

The amount of fish in the central Arctic Ocean is very limited. Therefore, the fish stock needs to be protected when the Arctic Ocean becomes increasingly accessible due to melting sea ice. Pauline Leijonmalm, Chief Scientist during the Oden Expedition Synoptic Arctic Survey 2021, can look back on a successful expedition where the researchers could collect valuable data about the ecosystem in the Arctic.

Increase in climate emissions within the industry and energy sector in 2021

The Swedish Environmental Protection Agency recently published Sweden's official statistics for emissions and uptake of greenhouse gases for 2021.

Sweden's territorial emissions of greenhouse gases increased by 3.4 percent in 2021 compared to 2020. The main explanation for the increase in emissions is the industry's rise from low production levels and increased use of fossil fuels in the electricity and heating sector, which was caused by colder weather and higher electricity prices. Sweden's long-term climate goal means that emissions of greenhouse gases must be net zero by 2045 at the latest.
