# Letter from the director

In the last four years, both SUITS and Turkey have seen a lot of changes. What has not changed is SUITS' commitment to independent research that crosses disciplinary boundaries and to communicating our expertise to a broad audience. Indeed, as Turkish politics have become increasingly contentious and the already significant divides in Turkish society have become deeper still, the need for independent and non-partisan scholarship has grown correspondingly.

It is increasingly important for international institutions of higher education to support independent scholarship on Turkey. Organisations such as Scholars at Risk, the Scholars Rescue Fund, and the Council for At-Risk Academics all report a dramatic escalation in the number of applications for support by academics from Turkey, who no longer feel free to conduct independent and critical scholarship in their native country.

SUITS is a place where independent research on Turkish affairs is allowed and protected even if it is critical - we do not have any "editorial line" or policy agenda. As SUITS' Director, one of my most important duties is to safeguard this space for independent and high-quality scholarship. Critical thinking and scholarship is absolutely essential for good policy making and healthy and well-informed democratic deliberation.

is completing his PhD from the University of Nottingham examining intelligence cooperation between the US and the UK and how this cooperation has impacted smaller states. His dissertation work, with a fellowship from the Swedish Institute, combines comparative politics, international history, and security studies to complicate and refine our views on cooperation, competition, and their aftermaths in the Near Fast.

holds a Ph.D. in Political Science and International Relations from the University of Turin (Italy). In her dissertation, she investigated the redefinition of Turkish secularism through the institution of female preachers (vaizeler) employed by the Turkish Presidency of Religious Affairs (Diyanet). At SUITS she is researching the activities carried out by Diyanet's female preachers within the Turkish Muslim communities in Sweden.
