## Letter from the director

### **Academic freedom, CEST events and our move**

After a pandemic-induced pause last year, the annual Consortium for European Symposia on Turkey (CEST) winter symposium will be organized by the University of Naples 'L'Orientale'. We are also introducing a new CEST "summer school", organized by the University of Duisburg-Essen and Academy in Exile, Berlin, which this year will be held virtually in October. The generous support of the Mercator Foundation, the Swedish Institute, and Granholms Stiftelse at Stockholm University has made CEST's expansion possible.



In the difficult environment for many Turkish academics, SUITS continues to stand up for our own faculty when, as happens, they become targets. We have also provided a safe venue for Turkish academics via our collaboration with Scholars at Risk in the past year.

Next year will mark a new beginning of sorts for SUITS, as we move to the Department of Economic History and International Relations. While we will miss our colleagues at our current department (IAMT), the move will place us in a dynamic social science research environment with more possibilities for synergy and collaboration. After nearly a decade at IAMT, we say our thanks and look forward to exciting opportunities ahead.


Jenny White and Ergün Gündüz's graphic novel launches to wide acclaim
