We would also like to remind you about the open call for nominations for the RT1 leader position. The Nomination Deadline is 31 January 2024.


Don't miss the deadline for abstract submission for the Swedish Climate Symposium on 18 January.

An opportunity has come up to do some outreach at a local school in Solna. The school is looking for a few scientists to come and work with a group of 10-12-year-olds who are learning about the scientific process.

They have asked if it would be possible to run a small project or two, so the students can learn how scientists work and the kinds of questions they are interested in. This project could be something incredibly simple – previously, for example, we have measured outdoor air quality with a simple hand-held monitor, measured the pH in water samples, and carried out experiments using paper chromatography.

The visit would be for a couple of hours, towards the end of January or the beginning of February.

Nominees for the "Albert Einstein" World Award of Science should be eminent scientists whose achievements can serve as an inspiration for future generations. Considerations will be given to individuals or institutions in one of the Life Sciences, such as Neuroscience, Earth Science, Biology, Biochemistry, or Chemistry; or in one of the Natural Sciences such as Physics, Mathematics or Astronomy. The prize is awarded every year.
