Cognitive Development & Decision-Making in Adolescence

• In adolescence, the brain is changing in structure and function

 Although adolescents have strengths and capabilities, there can be increased likelihood of sensation-seeking, risk-taking, and reckless behavior

Mature social cognitions are more frequent from 16 to 19 years old
