Policy on cheating and plagiarism

University studies in the humanities involve practice in expressing one's own words and thoughts in writing. It is therefore important that you are aware from the start of what it means to plagiarize a text so that this can be avoided.

If you copy someone else's or your own text and ideas without indicating the source, you are guilty of plagiarism. This also applies if you paraphrase a text or idea that you have found in a book, magazine, newspaper or on the web or generated with the help of AI without referring to this source in any way. The department has zero tolerance for plagiarism and it is considered cheating. According to Stockholm University's guidelines for disciplinary matters, plagiarism is a disciplinary offense that can lead to suspension from the university.

Texts submitted to our learning and collaboration platform are checked using a text-matching tool. This means that these texts are matched against text that is available on the internet. If you have copied texts from the Internet, even if you have replaced certain words or sentences, the text-matching tool will detect this. This also applies if you have cut and pasted from, for example, an English text and then translated this in Google translate. Keep in mind that much of the course literature is also published on the internet. This means that the text-matching tool detects if you have copied text from the course literature.
