IGV Administration and staff

- Lokaloptimeringsprojektet, LOP (28th Aug 2025): LOP is SU's large-scale ongoing initiative aimed at optimizing premises useage to support current and future SU needs, including making more

teaching rooms available to support the humanities sections. We (Viktoria, Alasdair and I) met with SU's Real Estate management team for the LOP project to share IGVs perspectives about our specific teaching/ locality needs (classrooms).

- -We emphasized our specialist requirements for optimally equipped and located classrooms <u>in</u> <u>the Geohouse</u>, so that we can easily transport teaching materials, e.g. rocks specimens, teaching lap tops, rotating water tanks, etc for teaching.

- EU Science funding. The EU plans to double Horizon Europe's budget to €175 billion (2028–2034), strengthening support for early-career researchers, team science, and high-risk "moonshot" projects. The move signals growing EU ambition for global scientific leadership, especially as the U.S. faces proposed cuts to federal research funding under Trump's draft budget.
- **SU Strategic Försknings Området (SFO)** initiative 'Data Driven Polar Research', Sept 4th information meeting.
- AI chatbots lie (and hallucinate): Article in the journal Science (25 Jul 2025): AI chatbots often
 fabricate or mislead due to role-playing prompts & training that favors pleasing users. This can
 cause real-world harm, yet regulation lags behind.
