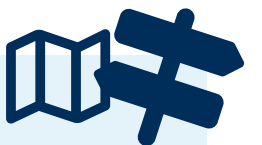

Entry requirements

General entry requirements

To be eligible for a master's programme at Stockholm University, you must have a bachelor's degree (equivalent to a Swedish *kandidatexamen*) from an internationally recognised university. Find the equivalent level of degree from your country of study on the national admissions website: universityadmissions.se

Specific entry requirements

Each master's programme has its own specific entry requirements, be sure to check the details for your chosen programme: su.se/mastersprogrammes

Additionally, all applicants must demonstrate proficiency in English. Learn more about the accepted English language tests and requirements here: su.se/entryrequirements

Final-Year Bachelor's Students

If you are in your final year of undergraduate studies, you can still apply for a master's programme at Stockholm University. You must provide:

- An official transcript for all completed semesters to date
- An official document from your university certifying that you are an active student in your last year

Application and tuition fees

If you are a non-EU/EEA or Swiss citizen, you are required to pay:

- Application fee: SEK 900
- Tuition fees per academic year:
 - Humanities, Social Sciences & Law: SEK 90,000
 - Sciences: SEK 140,000

(Some programmes have special prices that are higher than indicated above.)



Scholarships

Stockholm University Scholarship Scheme

Stockholm University offers tuition fee waivers for highly talented students from non-EU/EEA/Swiss countries who are required to pay tuition fees.

Swedish Institute Scholarships

The Swedish Institute provides two scholarship programmes for master's students, covering both tuition fees and living costs. These scholarships are available for specific master's programmes and students from eligible countries.

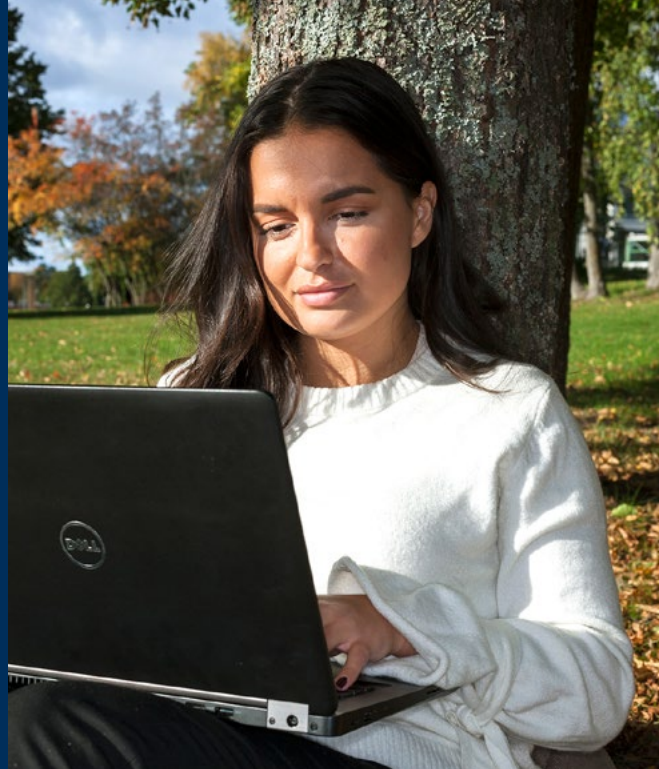

FIRST ADMISSIONS ROUND (open for all students)

**16 October
–15 January**



Note. Many international programmes are only open in the first admissions round.

SECOND ADMISSIONS ROUND (EU/EEA/Swiss citizens only)

**16 March
–15 April**

1. FIND YOUR PROGRAMME

Explore our course catalogue and choose the Master's programme that suits your academic and career goals.

2. CHECK THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Review the general and programme-specific entry requirements, as well as the selection criteria.

3. CHECK FOR ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS

Some programmes require extra documents. Make sure to check the programme page for details.

4. CREATE AN ACCOUNT & SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

Apply online at universityadmissions.se before the deadline.

5. SUBMIT SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

Submit the required documents to University Admissions at the latest by the given deadline, preferably as early as possible.

6. CHECK UNIVERSITY ADMISSIONS

Log-in to University Admissions to see your Notification of selection results 26 March.

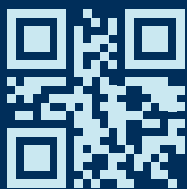


Learning Swedish

15 January 2026

Application deadline. Please apply as early as possible before the deadline.

2 February 2026

Deadline for receipt of supporting documentation.

Deadline to either pay the application fee (for citizens outside of EU/EEA and Switzerland) or show fee exemption status (for citizens within EU/EEA and Switzerland).

Please complete this step as early as possible before the deadline.

26 March 2026

Notification of selection results for applications to Master's programmes.

31 August 2026

Start of the semester. Welcome to Stockholm!
