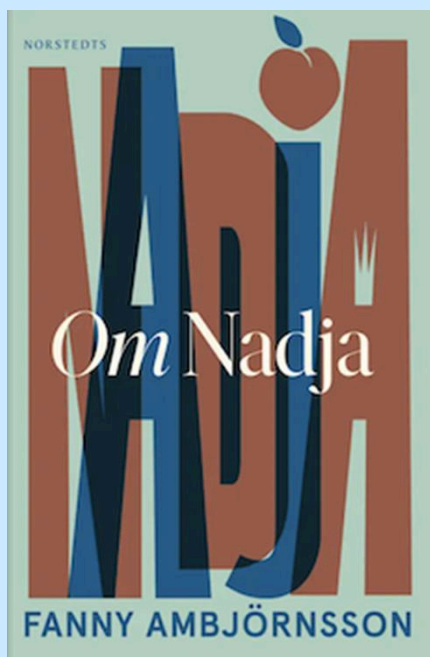


Autoethnographies of Care:

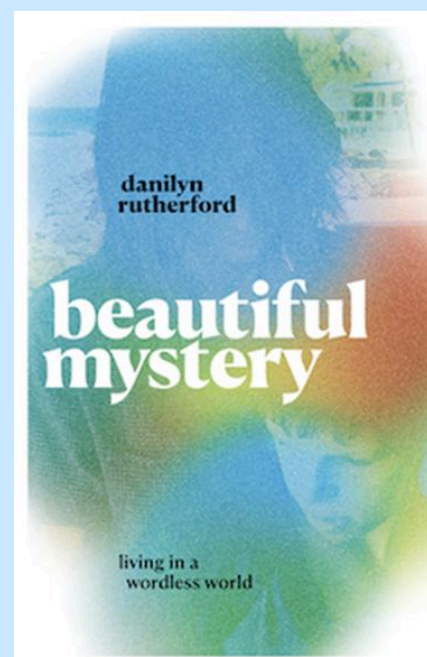
A Conversation with Fanny Ambjörnsson & Danilyn Rutherford

Om Nadjä. En systers berättelse is a mixture of biography and autoethnography, which breaks away from academic conventions. Om Nadjä, centering around the life of Ambjörnsson's younger sister Nadjä and extended family, is an attempt to approach a life lived outside presumed paths. It explores issues of dependence, asymmetry, solidarity, and dignity in a society where autonomy and norm-following functionality are presented as the ultimate goal.

Beautiful Mystery explores what it means to be a person in the spaces between what we can and cannot say, and how we can fight to care for those we love when they don't have the language to fight for themselves. Through her unique lens as a mother and an anthropologist, Rutherford tells the story of arriving in Millie's world, what she found there, and how Millie showed her that words aren't always what makes us human.
